## Street Resurfacing Set to Begin Soon

The Oklahoma City Council has awarded the contract for the resurfacing of the streets in our West Watch Neighborhood Additions to Markwell Paving. You may have already encountered them as they have started the first phase of the project called "Base Repair". This portion of the project continued throughout the holidays. The actual massive resurfacing process will begin soon.

The resurfacing will begin on the east side of our addition with Westridge Drive, and will gradually proceed west. **All vehicles must be off the street during this phase.** Markwell Paving will post flyers on your doors alerting you as to when they will be starting on your street, allowing you ample opportunity to move your vehicles from the street. In the unfortunate event that a car is left in the street and the crews are ready to begin work on that street, the contractor has the right to have the car towed. The contractor and I feel very confident that with all of us working together that these drastic measures will not have to occur in our neighborhood.

When the actual resurfacing project begins, a large machine will start milling the street surface into dump trucks. The street will be milled and the asphalt stored for recycling into new asphalt. After your street is milled, a process will begin to lay down the new asphalt. The new asphalt will then be applied and rolled in weather permitting. Milling will not begin unless application temperatures are above 45° F.

We are asking for your patience and cooperation during the slight and temporary disruption in our daily lives this project may cause.
